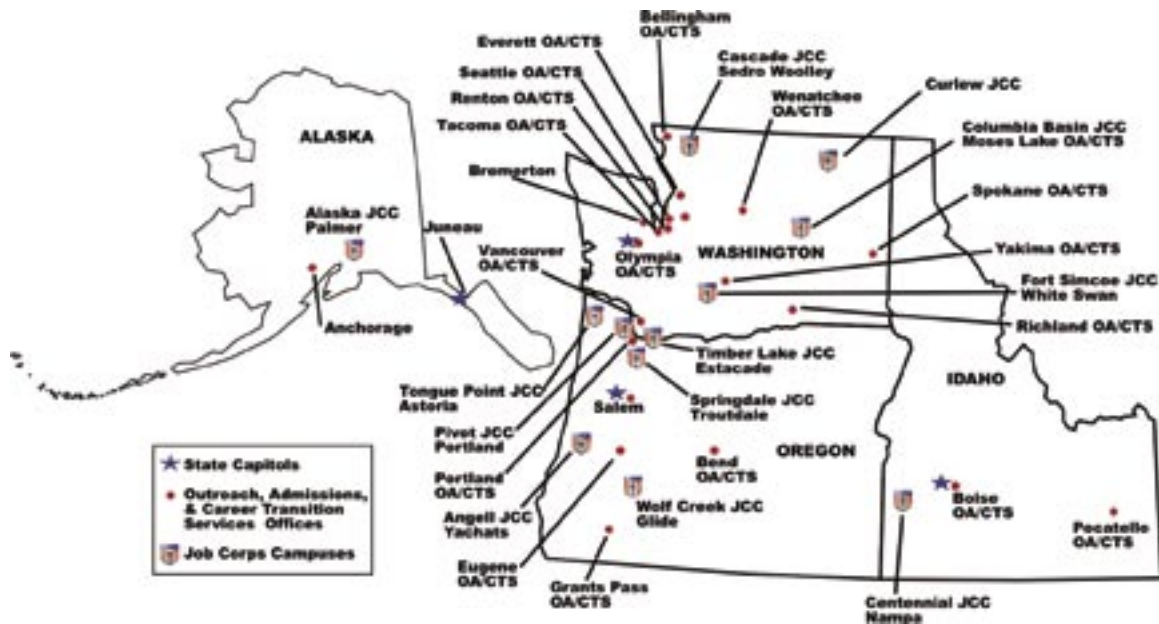

**Twelve Job Corps Centers in Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, and Washington provide training to over 4,000 young men and women each year. Centers are operated by the U.S. Forest Service, the Bureau of Reclamation, and private contractors.**



**Alaska (Alaska)**

Located in Palmer, in the foothills of the Chugach Mountain Range, 44 miles northeast of Anchorage. Moose, foxes, and eagles visit throughout the year. The Matanuska-Susitna Valley offers hiking, fishing, hunting, and rafting, and several shopping malls are nearby. Enrollment is restricted to residents of Alaska.

**CAPACITY: 250**

**Tongue Point (Oregon)**

About 90 miles from Portland, where the Columbia River meets the Pacific Ocean. The forest and river are breathtaking. The town of Astoria has plenty of stores and restaurants.

**CAPACITY: 540**

**Springdale (Oregon)**

Near the historic city of Troutdale, 30 minutes from Portland, nestled among beautiful evergreen trees on the banks of the Sandy River.

**CAPACITY: 165**

**Pivot (Oregon)**

Located in Montgomery Business Park, just outside downtown Portland. Close to big-city shopping and a mass-transit system. (This is a nonresidential program restricted to women ages 17-24).

**CAPACITY: 60**

**Timber Lake (Oregon)**

Timber Lake is located 60 miles southeast of Portland in the Mount Hood National Forest. Great shopping and services are only an hour away. (Operated by the U.S. Forest Service.)

**CAPACITY: 234**

**Angell (Oregon)**

On the beautiful Oregon coast near Waldport. The city of Newport, 20 miles north, provides recreation and shopping. (Operated by the U.S. Forest Service.)

**CAPACITY: 216**

**Wolf Creek (Oregon)**

In the majestic Umpqua National Forest, surrounded by the steep foothills of the Cascade Mountains. Roseburg, 28 miles away, has ample shopping and services. (Operated by the U.S. Forest Service.)

**CAPACITY: 231**

**Cascades (Washington)**

Tucked in the Skagit Valley at the foot of the Cascade Mountains, about 70 miles north of Seattle. Students ride buses to shop in nearby Sedro Woolley, Burlington, and Mount Vernon.

**CAPACITY: 327**

**Columbia Basin (Washington)**

Located in central Washington just three miles north of Moses Lake, with three main shopping areas plus parks, recreation fields and an aquatic center. (Operated by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation.)

**CAPACITY: 250**

**Curlew (Washington)**

About 150 miles from Spokane in the beautiful Colville National Forest. Republic is just 30 miles away and Colville is approximately 65 miles away. (Operated by the U.S. Forest Service.)

**CAPACITY: 198**

**Fort Simcoe (Washington)**

On the eastern foothills of the Cascade Mountains, on the Yakama Indian Reservation. Forty-five miles southwest of Yakima. Shops and recreation are close by, as well as professional minor league baseball and basketball. (Operated by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation.)

**CAPACITY: 224**

**Centennial (Idaho)**

Just 20 miles west of Boise, in the heart of the Snake River Valley of southwest Idaho. The town of Nampa has a professional basketball team, and the Snake River Stampede Rodeo is a yearly attraction. (Operated by the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation.)

**CAPACITY: 300**
