

Bibliographic Citations

1. BOOK with one author

Author's last name, First name. Title of book. City of publication: Publisher, Date of publication.

Example:

Hobbs, Robert. Fishing for a Great Hobby. New York: Abrams Publishing Company, 1987.

2. BOOK with two or three authors

Author's last name, First name, and First name of second author Last name. Title of book. Place of publication: Publisher, Date of publication.

Example:

Barr, Alfred H. and Charles Burchfield. Fly Fishing. New York: Museum of Modern Art, 1953.

3. Same author-two or more BOOKS

Author's last name, First name. Title. Place of publication: Publisher, Date of Publication.

-----Title. Place of publication: Publisher, Date of publication.

Example:

Dennis, James M. Artists in America. Columbia: University of Missouri Press, 1966.

-----A Study in American Art and Culture. New York: Viking Press, 1975.

4) BOOK with an editor but no author

Editor's last name, First name, ed. Title. Place of publication: Publisher, Date of Publication.

Example:

McCoubrey, John, ed. Modern American Painting. New York: Time-Life, 1970.

5. ENCYCLOPEDIA (book format)

Author's last name, First name. (Author's name, if given, is found at the end of the article). "Title of the Subject." Title of Encyclopedia. Date of publication.

Example:

Boyton, Robert. "Realism." World Book Encyclopedia. 1990 ed.

6. MAGAZINE article

Author's last name, First name. "Title of Article." Title of Magazine Date of publication with day before month year: page numbers.

Example:

Wooden, Howard E. "A Regionalist's Interpretation of the Four Seasons." American Artist 10 July 1991: 58.

7) NEWSPAPER article

Author's last name, First name. "Title of article." Title of Newspaper Date of publication with day before month year: section: page numbers.

Example:

Artner, Alan G. "An American Original: The Unique Midwestern Vision of an Artist." Chicago Tribune 15 January 1984: sec. 10: 15-19.

8) TELEVISION show

Title of television show. Directors. Actors. Studio. Date.

Example:

The Last Emperor. Dir. Bernardo Bertolucci. With John Lone and Peter O'Toole. Columbia. 1987.

9. Work included in an ANTHOLOGY

Last name of author of article, First name. "Title of Article/Chapter." Title of Anthology. Place of publication: Publisher, Date of publication.

Example:

Rosenblum, Robert. "The Primal American Scene." The Natural Paradise: Painting in America. New York: Museum of Modern Art, 1976.

COMPUTER CITATIONS

1. INTERNET – World Wide Web Citation

Author's Last name, First name. "Article Title" (date): page/s if given or n.pag. The word *On-Line* (which means no print version). Source. Your date of access. The word *Available*: full internet address (URL)

Example:

Bowker, Samuel T. "Cyber Space Debate" (12 Sept. 1996): n.pag. On-Line. Internet. 5 Oct. 1996. Available: WWW:<http://www.ppc.new.edu/home/stb/com>.

2. CD-Rom ENCYCLOPEDIA

Author's Last name, First name. "Article's Title." Source. Date of ency. Title of source database. Database format. Producer of the database and its copyright date.

Example:

Brooks, Mary. "Shark." The World Book Encyclopedia. 1995. The World Book Multimedia Encyclopedia. CD-ROM. World Book, Inc. 1995.
