Learners adapt, communicate, and exchange learning products with others in a cycle.

Learners adjust their awareness of the global learning community.

AASL Domain C. Share

Learners exhibit empathy with and tolerance for diverse ideas.

Learners demonstrate empathy and equity in knowledge building within the global learning community.

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V. EXPLORE: Discover and innovate in a growth mindset developed through experience and reflection.

AASL Domain A. Think
Learners develop and satisfy personal curiosity.

1. I can read widely and deeply in multiple formats and write and create for a variety of purposes.
2. I can reflect and question assumptions and possible misconceptions.
3. I can engage in inquiry-based processes for personal growth.

AASL Domain B. Create
Learners construct new knowledge.
